1. Registration Form

2. Letter of Recommendation

- a. 1 letter of recommendation should be provided for new prospective members.
- b. Letters of recommendation should be sent directly to <u>troyauxiliary@troy.edu</u> from the recommender, NOT from the auditionee.
- c. Letters of recommendation must come from a band director, auxiliary coach/coordinator, or studio instructor.
- d. Letters of recommendation from teachers, professors, parents, other family members, or bosses will not be accepted.
- e. Additional recommendation letters will not be considered in scoring.

3. Interview

- a. Interested students must complete an interview with the Auxiliary Coordinator and judges on the day of auditions.
- b. Please dress professionally for your interview.
- c. Be prepared to answer questions about your previous experience in auxiliaries, your experience working with others, and how you can contribute to the SOTS Auxiliaries.

4. In-Person Clinic (OPTIONAL)

- a. An in-person clinic will be offered to all prospective members on March 15, 2025 as an opportunity to receive help with the basics portion of the audition.
- b. The clinic will be run by the chosen captains.
- c. Individual routines and day-of routines will not be taught or discussed at the clinic.

5. In-Person Audition

- a. On April 5, 2025, students will demonstrate several basic skills, a prechoreographed individual routine, a pregame routine and a routine that they will learn on the day of auditions. Videos of the required basics will be provided in advance.
- b. Students should demonstrate professionalism and appropriate audition etiquette throughout the audition process.
- c. Current auxiliary members will be present at auditions to perform basics and routines alongside prospective members for skill comparison purposes by the judges.

- d. In-person auditions are closed to the public, including parents and family members.
 - i. Basic Skills
 - 1. L and R split
 - 2. Double Pirouette
 - 3. Coupe
 - 4. Grand Jete (Split Leap)- L and R
 - 5. Calypso
 - 6. Jazz run
 - 7. High Kicks
 - 8. Axel Leap
 - 9. Across the floor combo (includes kicks)
 - 10. 3 Additional Skills of your choosing (Aerial, Fuete, etc.)
 - 11. Fight Song
 - ii. Group Routine
 - 1. A short routine (less than 1 minute in length) will be taught on the day of auditions and will be performed by prospective members.
 - 2. Judges will watch the entire group of prospective members perform the routine, then will watch small groups.

iii. Individual routine

- 1. Prospective members should choreograph a routine that highlights their skill and performance.
- 2. Individual routines should be 1 minute and 30 seconds to 1 minute and 45 seconds in length.
- 3. The routine may be performed to the song of your choice but should not contain questionable or inappropriate lyrics.
- 4. You may choose to have assistance in choreographing your routine, but it is not necessary. You will not be scored on your choreography, but on your execution and performance.
- 5. You must submit your audition music to troyauxiliary@troy.edu as an audio file by April 1, 2025.

Attire

- For the basic skill and group routine portions of the audition, prospective members should wear all-black, form-fitting athletic attire and jazz shoes. A black sports bra and black spandex shorts is also acceptable.
- Hair should be all down and curled.
- Makeup should be flattering and tasteful. We want to see your version of "game-day ready." A flattering shade of red lipstick is required for females.
- You may choose to change into performance attire for the individual routine portion of the audition, but this is not required.
