I am a classroom teacher but I am certified in administration. I need PLUs that are affordable and possible to complete with a full-time job, not in administration.

I love to learn and open to all topics. I do however think a more appropriate, out of contact hours daily pay is necessary.

I would like to see more opportunities for mental health counseling for children. There is also a need for coping strategies for early childhood students.

I would love to see more professional development geared for special education teachers that would help us implement effective instructional strategies to carry over into the general education environment and that aligns with what our resource students are doing in their classrooms.

Many more options for emergency certified teachers, ALA, classroom management, purposeful planning, ALA and ANA.

Opportunities for teachers to become published writers on pedagogy.

Our ESL population is growing every single year. I don't feel school systems are equipped with the resources or options needed for these students to be successful in their learning, especially level 1 students. The regular classroom and small bits of pullout aren't meeting their needs. We are not providing them with what they need or deserve.
